

HOMEWORK AND MATERIALS

Child's Stained Glass Sweater aka Zig Zag Sweater

For you to learn and experience this exciting technique please bring the following:

MATERIALS

YARN—your choice, worsted or D.K. Different weight yarn make different size sweaters.

Bring different shades of 2 color groups. From my experience, I suggest you bring the yarns you like to work with.

Sample sweater uses complementary colors, blues and oranges.

NEEDLES-- sizes that work with your yarn. i.e. #4, 5 or 6 for D.K.

Either circular, straight or double-pointed will do.

ACCESSORIES—Scissors, tape measure, pencil, yarn needle, calculator, stitch holders.

HOMEWORK

To practice edge stitches:

Cast on 11 stitches.

Row 1. With Color 1, Knit into the back of the 1st stitch, K9, slip the last stitch as if to purl with the yarn in front.

Row 2. Knit into the back of the 1st stitch, K9, slip the last stitch as if to purl with the yarn in front.

Row 3. With Color 2, Knit into the back of the 1st stitch K9, slip the last stitch as if to purl with the yarn in front

Row 4. Knit into the back of the 1st stitch, P9, slip the last stitch as if to purl with the yarn in front

Repeat rows 1-4 until you are comfortable with working the edge stitches

Last but not least, bring your curiosity and enthusiasm.
